As detailed in SER Guidance Note 12, SER has divided buildings into five risk groups: RG1A, RG1B, RG2A, RG2B and RG3. The third party designed items which will be permitted on Schedule 1 vary depending on the risk group, and are detailed to the right.

Please note: there is no longer an 'other' option for any risk group. There is a separate tutorial regarding the use of Schedule 1 and generation of Form Qs relating to legacy certificates and certificates which are linked to legacy certificates (e.g. additional stage(s) and amendments to warrant).
